

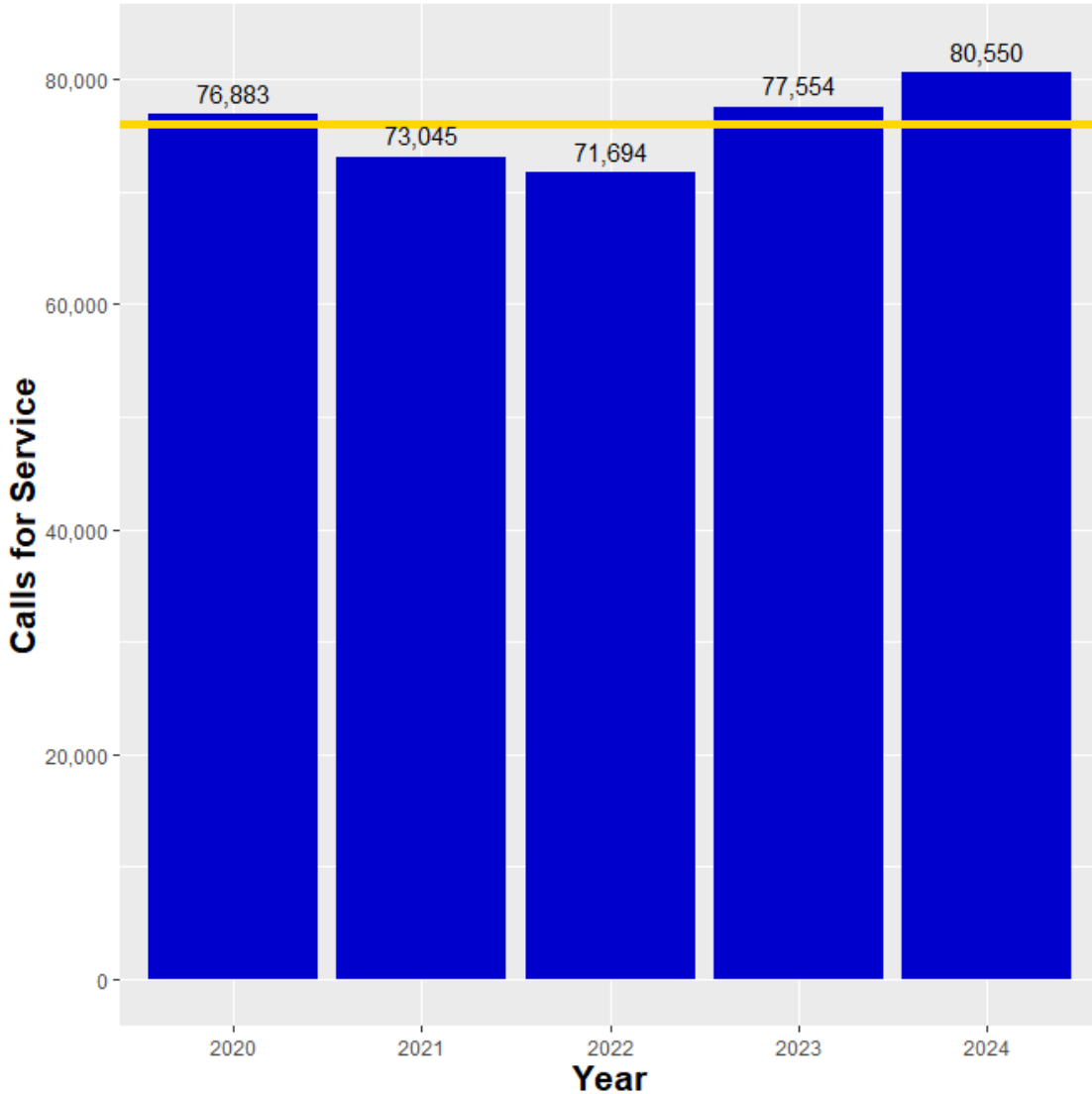

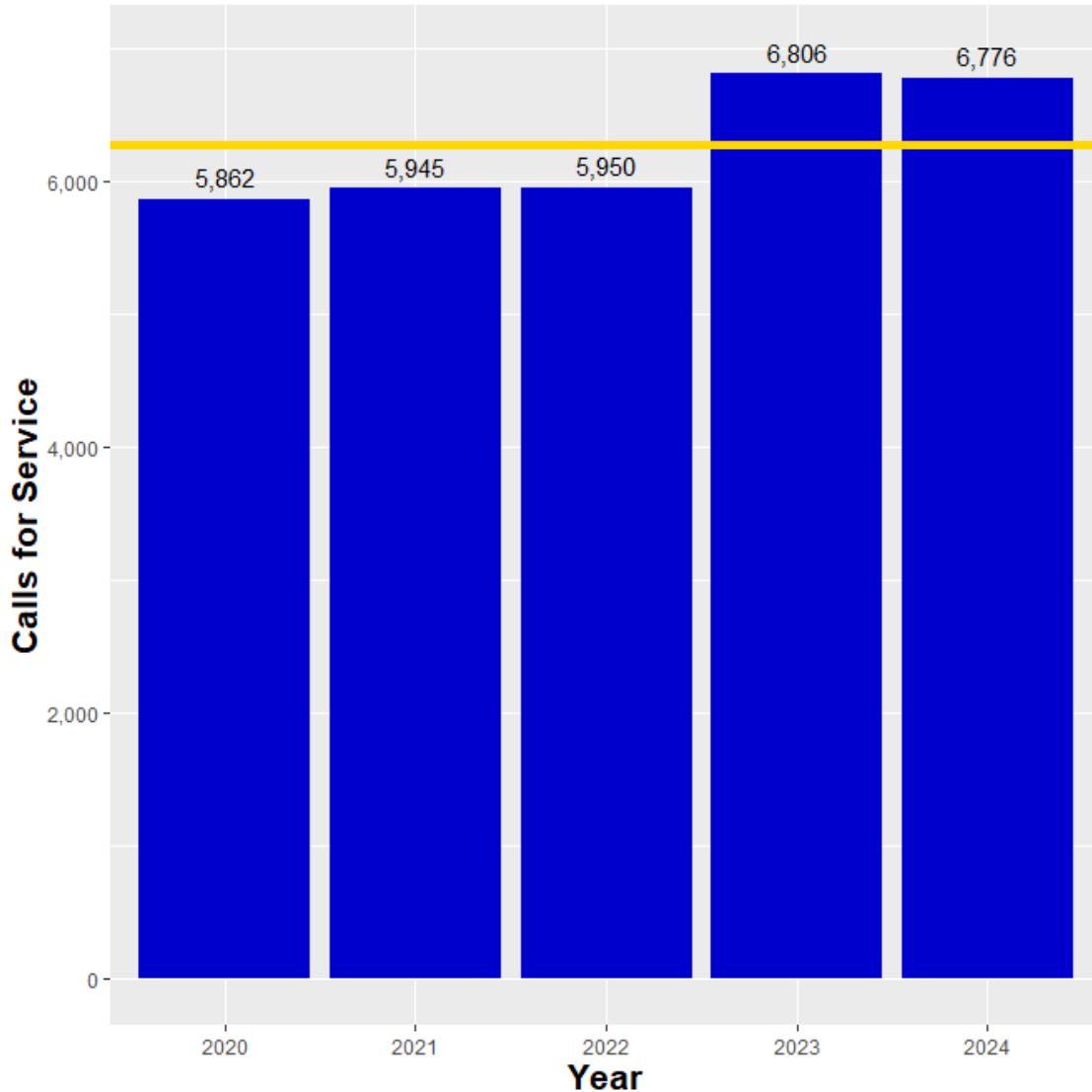
# Calls for Service – Citizen Generated Calls



Compared to Last Q3		
Priority	Difference	% Difference
Emergency	-30	-0.4%
Urgent	+663	+2%
Routine	+2,363	+6%
<b>TOTAL</b>	<b>+2,996</b>	<b>+4%</b>

- Moderate increase in overall call demand relative to last year.
- Time spent on scene continues to trend upwards. Median time is 61 minutes overall, twice as long for emergency calls (125 minutes)

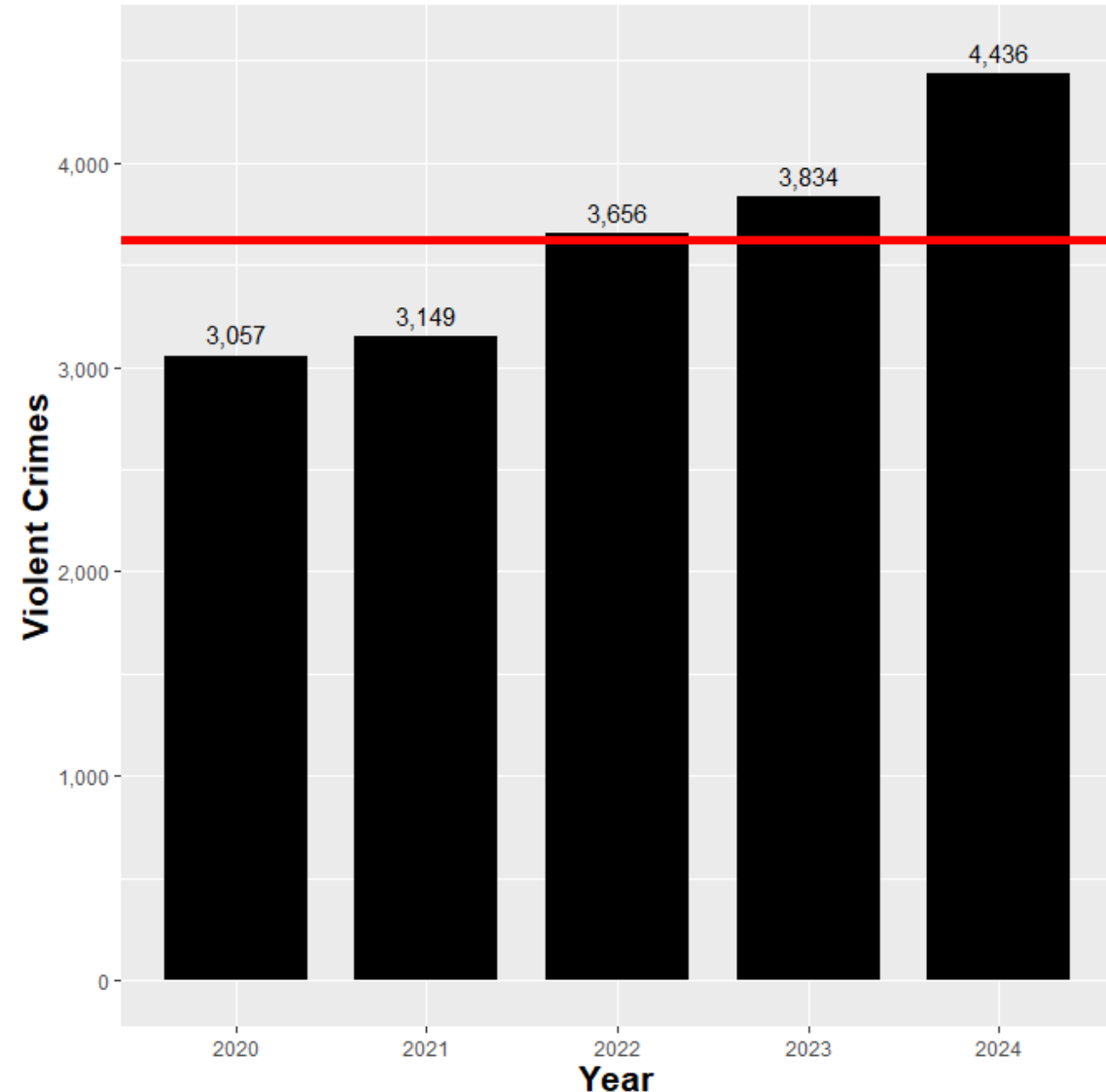
# Calls for Service - Emergency



Compared to Last Q3		
Priority	Difference	% Difference
Emergency	-30	-0.4%
Urgent	+663	+2%
Routine	+2,363	+6%
<b>TOTAL</b>	<b>+2,996</b>	<b>+4%</b>

- Little change in volume of emergency calls
- Median emergency response time has increased to over 9 minutes (9:19s); 38 seconds longer than last year
- Time spent on-scene at emergency calls has increased by 15 minutes compared to last year

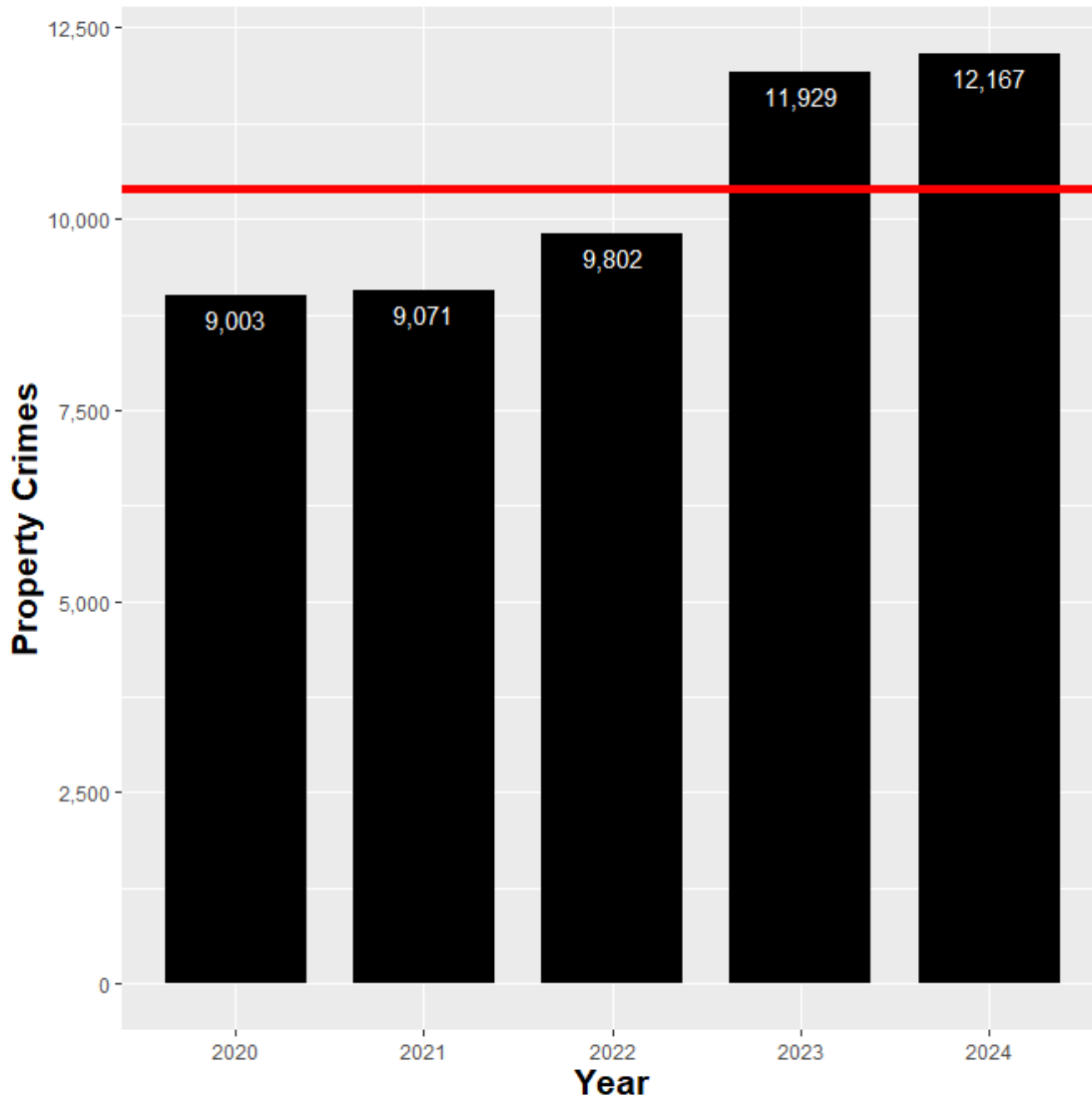
# Reported Crime - Violent



Compared to Last Q3		
Category	Difference	% Difference
Violent	+ 602	+ 16%
Property	+ 236	+ 2%
Other Criminal Code	+ 828	+ 20%

- Violent crime reports significantly higher year-over-year to the highest value since 2006
  - Largest increases in assault-level 1 and threatening
  - Intimate partner assault rose by 22%
- Shootings increased by 22%
  - 8 persons injured; 2 persons killed
- 16 carjackings YTD, an increase of 23% over last year

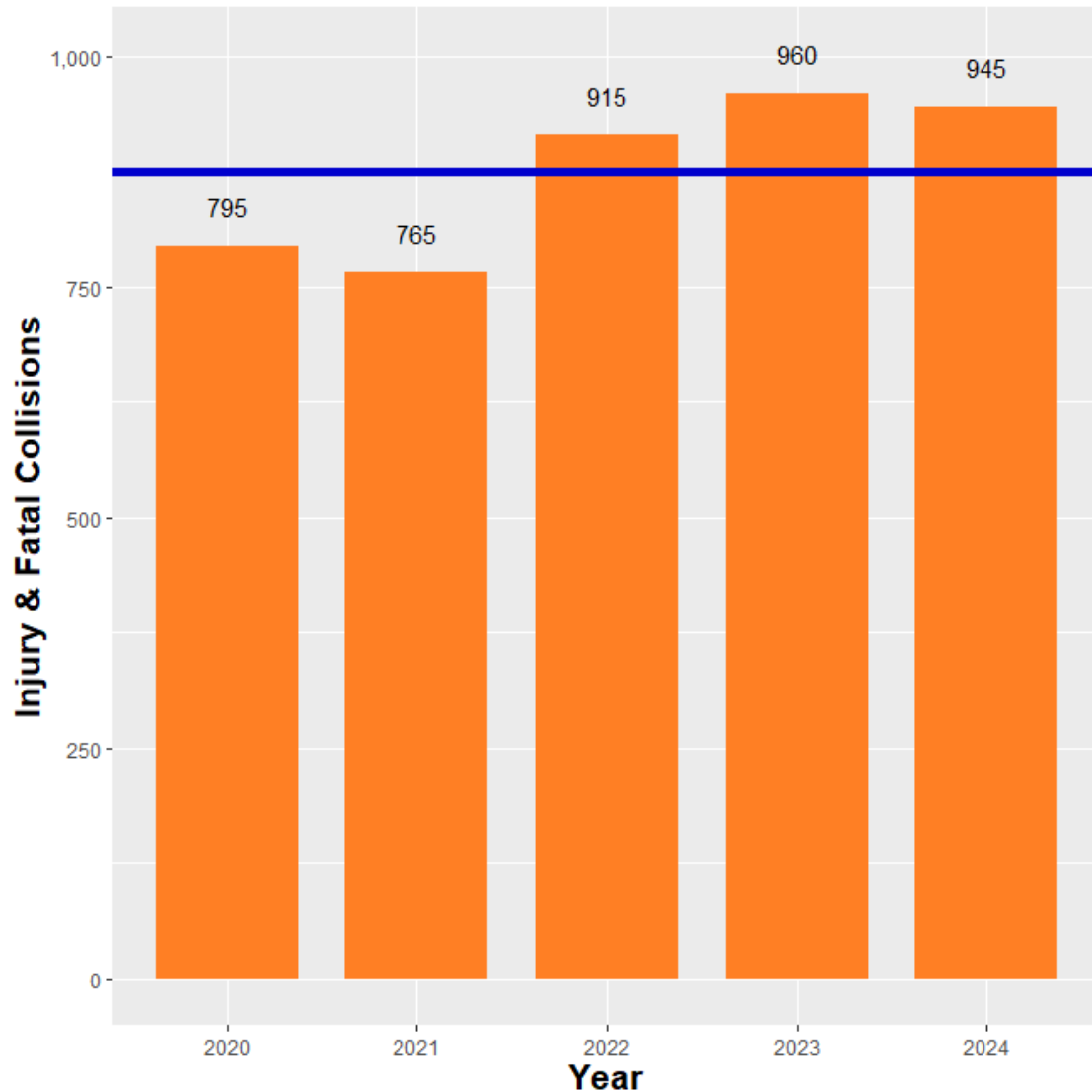
# Reported Crime - Property



Compared to Last Q3		
Category	Difference	% Difference
Violent	+ 602	+ 16%
<b>Property</b>	<b>+ 238</b>	<b>+ 2%</b>
Other Criminal Code	+ 828	+ 20%

- Little change in overall property crime numbers
  - Significant increase in theft under \$5k
  - 46% increase in break & enter to commercial properties
  - Declines in shoplifting and theft from vehicle reports
- Slight decline in vehicle theft reports (-4%); however, numbers are still much higher than any year since 2006

# Traffic Safety – Injury & Fatal Collisions



Compared to Last Q3		
Category	Difference	% Difference
Fatal	- 3	- 21%
Injury	- 12	- 1%
All Collisions	+ 582	+ 7%

- Number of fatal and injury collisions consistent year-over-year
  - 11 fatal collisions resulting in 12 fatalities
- Overall collisions higher by 7%
- Approximately 2% of fatal and injury-causing collisions are the result of impaired driving. This statistic is consistent with prior years.
